SewThankful Tracy's

Pieced Little Heart Block


Unfinished Size: 3.5 inches | Finished Size (after sewn into project): 3 inches

Cut the following:

| Fabric Color | # to Cut | Size |
|-------------------------|----------|-----------------------|
| Heart Color Rectangle | 2 | 2 inches x 3.5 inches |
| Background Color Square | 2 | 2 inches x 2 inches |
| Background Color Square | 4 | 1 inch x 1 inch |


Instructions:

- 1. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of each of the background fabric squares (reference image in #2 below) **OR use Diagonal Seam Tape** when sewing background squares to heart color rectangles (reference image on #3, page 2).
- 2. Place heart color rectangles right sides up. Place background color squares wrong sides up with drawn diagonal lines facing up, as shown below. **Note: These units should be mirror images**. (illustration not to scale—for reference purposes only)



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3. Stitch background squares to heart rectangles on the marked diagonal lines (OR use Diagonal Seam Tape). This will form two half heart rectangle blocks.





- 4. After all seams are sewn trim seam allowances to .25 inches then press seams to the dark side or press them open, whichever you prefer.
- 5. Sew the two rectangles together to form your heart block. Press seams open or to one side, whichever you prefer.
- 6. Square up block if necessary and have fun using in your next project. Flip the page to see how I used mine.

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This is how I used my heart block. I simply added borders log cabin style to get the size I needed to make this Collapsa-Bowl. The first round of logs is background color from the heart block (white). Then I used pink and purple logs to finish the Log Cabin Square.
